#### 1. INTENDED USE

As a reference standard for biological activity of Thrombopoietin.

#### 2. CAUTION

# This preparation is not for administration to humans or animals in the human food chain.

The preparation contains material of human origin, and either the final product or the source materials, from which it is derived, have been tested and found negative for HBsAg, anti-HIV and HCV RNA. As with all materials of biological origin, this preparation should be regarded as potentially hazardous to health. It should be used and discarded according to your own laboratory's safety procedures. Such safety procedures should include the wearing of protective gloves and avoiding the generation of aerosols. Care should be exercised in opening ampoules or vials, to avoid cuts.

### 3. UNITAGE

The preparation coded 03/124 containing human sequence recombinant Thrombopoietin (TPO) was found to possess TPO activity based on its ability to stimulate the proliferation of the megakaryocytic cell line MO7e, and in a murine cell line transfected with the human mpl receptor 32D/mpl+. This preparation is provided as a Reference Reagent for TPO bioassay, with an assigned potency of 5,000 Units per ampoule. It should be noted that this assigned potency is arbitrary, and does not reflect any pre-existing units for TPO activity, and it does not establish continuity with any pre-existing in-house standards. Users of the material should also note that the preparation 03/124 may be suitable to serve as a standard for the bioassay of TPO using assay methods based on other biological activities of TPO, but such applications have not been demonstrated for 03/124, and would require appropriate validation. Users who have data supporting the use of this preparation in another biological assay are encouraged to contact NIBSC.

# 4. CONTENTS

Country of origin of biological material: United Kingdom. Each ampoule contains the residue after freeze-drying of 1.0 ml of a solution comprising:

TPO approximately 500 nanograms 9.0 mg Sodium Chloride 1.0 mg Trehalose 2.0 mg Human Serum Albumin 0.1 microlitreTween 20

The TPO protein was expressed in Chinese hamster ovary (CHO) cells.

## 5. STORAGE

For economy of use, it is recommended that the solution be sub divided into several small aliquots and stored at  $\text{-}40^{\circ}\text{C}$  or below. The preparation should not be subjected to repeated thawing/freezing. Unopened ampoules should be stored at  $\text{-}20^{\circ}\text{C}$ .

Please note: because of the inherent stability of lyophilized material, NIBSC may ship these materials at ambient temperature.

# 6. DIRECTIONS FOR OPENING

DIN ampoules have an 'easy-open' coloured stress point, where the narrow ampoule stem joins the wider ampoule body. Various types of ampoule breaker are available commercially. To open the ampoule,

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tap the ampoule gently to collect material at the bottom (labelled) end and follow manufactures instructions provided with the ampoule breaker.

## 7. USE OF MATERIAL

No attempt should be made to weigh out any portion of the freeze-dried material prior to reconstitution.

Dissolve the total contents of the ampoule in 1.0 ml of sterile distilled water. This solution will contain TPO at a concentration of 5,000 Units/ml. Use carrier protein where extensive dilution is required.

## 8. STABILITY

Reference materials are held at NIBSC within assured, temperature-controlled storage facilities and they should be stored on receipt as indicated on the label. Accelerated degradation studies have indicated that this material is suitably stable, when stored at -20°C or below, for the assigned values to remain valid until the material is withdrawn or replaced. These studies have also shown that the material is suitably stable for shipment at ambient temperature without any effect on the assigned values. Once reconstituted, diluted or aliquoted, users should determine the stability of the material according to their own method of preparation, storage and use. Users who have data supporting any deterioration in the characteristics of any reference preparation are encouraged to contact NIBSC.
