

**WHO International Standard** Follicle-Stimulating Hormone, human, recombinant, 3rd International Standard NIBSC code: 20/218 Instructions for use (Version 1.0, Dated 03/11/2021)

### 1. INTENDED USE

The International Standard (IS) for recombinant human follicle-stimulating hormone (rhFSH) has been available since 1995 and is widely used to calibrate rhFSH bioassays. Stocks of the 2<sup>nd</sup> IS for rhFSH, coded 08/282, are almost depleted and the World Health Organisation (WHO) Expert Committee on Biological Standardisation (ECBS) has recognised (2019) the need for a replacement IS for continued assignment of potency to therapeutic preparations of rhFSH used in the treatment of infertility. The 3<sup>rd</sup> IS, coded 20/218, was established at the 74<sup>th</sup> meeting of the ECBS in October 2021. It replaces the 2<sup>nd</sup> IS, 08/282, which is discontinued.

#### CAUTION

## This preparation is not for administration to humans or animals in the human food chain.

The preparation contains material of human origin, and either the final product or the source materials, from which it is derived, have been tested and found negative for HBsAg, anti-HIV and HCV RNA. As with all materials of biological origin, this preparation should be regarded as potentially hazardous to health. It should be used and discarded according to your own laboratory's safety procedures. Such safety procedures should include the wearing of protective gloves and avoiding the generation of aerosols. Care should be exercised in opening ampoules or vials, to avoid cuts.

### 3. UNITAGE

Each ampoule contains 137 International Units

## 4. CONTENTS

Country of origin of biological material: United Kingdom.

Each ampoule contains the residue after freeze-drying of 0.5 mL of a solution that contained:

Approx 10 µg rhFSH 0.2% w/v human serum albumin 1% w/v mannitol 15.4 mM sodium chloride

## 5. STORAGE

Unopened ampoules should be stored at -20°C

Please note: because of the inherent stability of lyophilized material, NIBSC may ship these materials at ambient temperature.

## 6. DIRECTIONS FOR OPENING

DIN ampoules have an 'easy-open' coloured stress point, where the narrow ampoule stem joins the wider ampoule body. Various types of ampoule breaker are available commercially. To open the ampoule, tap the ampoule gently to collect material at the bottom (labelled) end and follow manufactures instructions provided with the ampoule breaker.

## 7. USE OF MATERIAL

No attempt should be made to weigh out any portion of the freeze-dried material prior to reconstitution

For practical purposes each ampoule contains the same quantity of rhFSH. The entire content of each ampoule should be completely

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dissolved in an accurately measured amount of buffer solution. The use of water to reconstitute ampoule contents is not recommended. The material has not been sterilized and the ampoules contain no bacteriostat.

## **COLLABORATIVE STUDY**

The preparation was evaluated in a collaborative study in which six laboratories in six countries took part, organised with the following aims:

- 1) To assign a potency, in International Units (IU), to the candidate standard, 20/218, relative to the  $2^{\rm nd}$  IS, 08/282, by in vivo bioassay.
- 2) To assess the suitability of the candidate preparation, 20/218, to serve as the 3<sup>rd</sup> International Standard for the calibration of therapeutic FSH products by bioassay.
- 3) To determine the stability of the candidate preparation, 20/218, by comparison with ampoules stored at elevated temperatures as part of an accelerated degradation stability study.

The geometric mean potency in the candidate preparation, 20/218, calculated from all laboratories, using organ weight as assay response, was 137.3 IU per ampoule (n=14; 95% confidence limits 132.7-142.17; GCV 7.5%).

The candidate preparation, 20/218, is sufficiently stable to serve as an International Standard since no significant loss in bioactivity was found at any of the elevated temperatures. This suggests that 20/218 is likely to be highly stable under long term storage conditions at -20°C.

#### 8. STABILITY

It is the policy of WHO not to assign an expiry date to their international reference materials. They remain valid with the assigned potency and status until withdrawn or amended.

materials are held at NIBSC within Reference temperaturecontrolled storage facilities. Reference Materials should be stored on receipt as indicated on the label.

In addition, once reconstituted, diluted or aliquoted, users should determine the stability of the material according to their own method of preparation, storage and use. Users who have data supporting any deterioration in the characteristics of any reference preparation are encouraged to contact NIBSC.
